- *Men's Breakfast at Studebakers Restaurant is always the first Saturday of the month at 8:30 AM.
- *The 2023 offering envelopes are ready for pickup in the Fellowship Hall or at the church anytime between office hours. (10:00 AM to 2:00 PM)
- *There will be no Bible Study during the month of January.
- *If you need pastoral care from January 4 through the 18th, please call the Lay Leader, Karen Grube, 937 232 1956. Pastor Ken will be out of the office during this time.
- *Likewise, there will be no Adult Sunday School following worship during Pastor Ken's absence.

Please be advised that the church is actively being monitored through an alarm/surveillance system as of January 2, 2023. The alarm will be off while there are people in the church for church business.

If you enter the building while the alarm is active, please note that it will need to be disarmed or the Clark County Sheriff's Office will be dispatched. The doors are alarmed. There are motion detectors and fire detectors.

The alarm system was obtained by the trustees upon receipt of a Federal Grant that could be used for security purposes.

Update from Missions

For the 2022 Christmas, we were given the names of 12 families that consisted of 24 children. These names come from local schools and one was from a member of our congregation that knew of the need.
